Era uma vez um grande palácio onde moravam o rei e sua linda filha, a princesa.



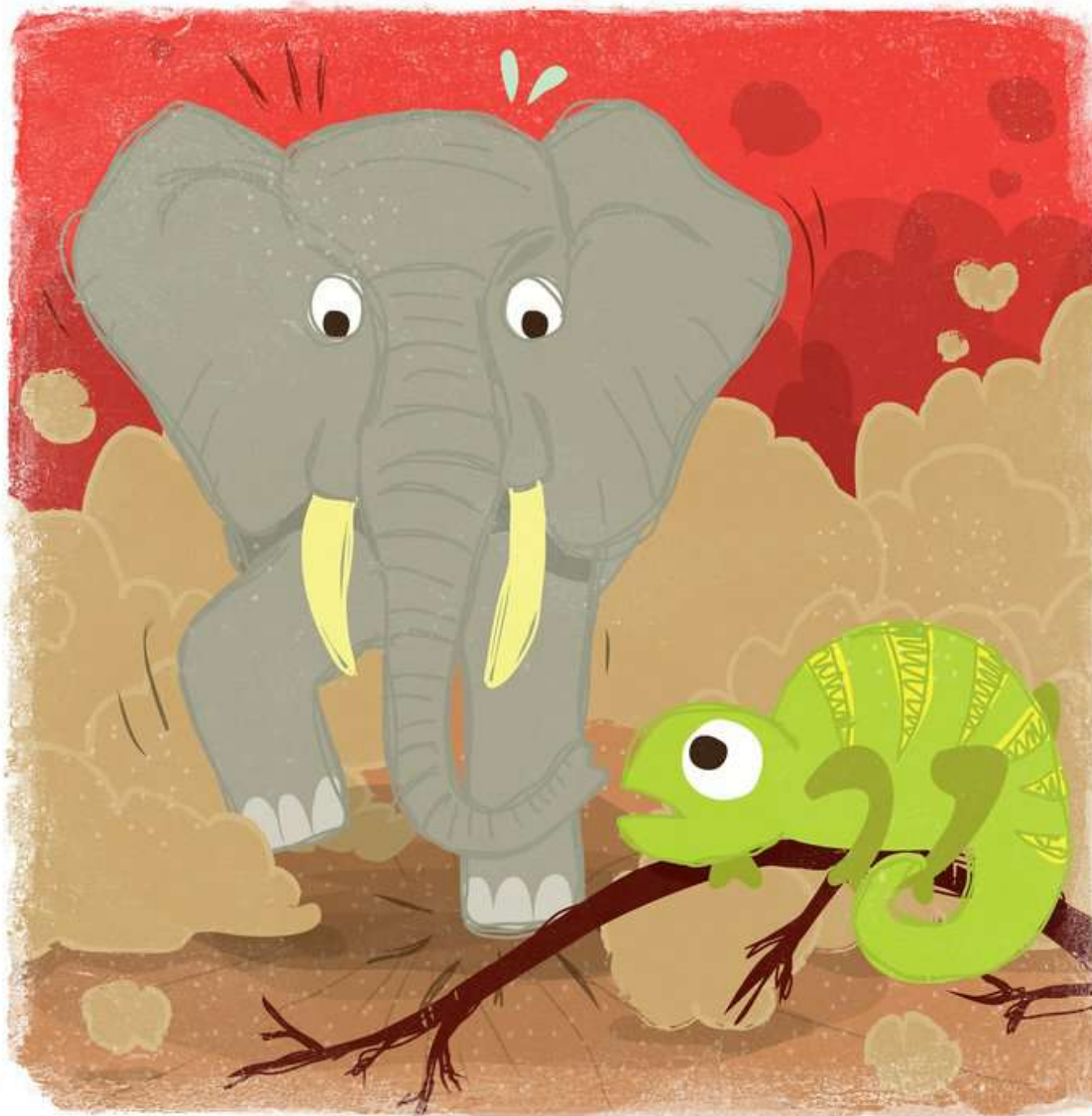
O Elefante vivia em uma casa em um dos lados do palácio. O Cameleão vivia do outro lado.



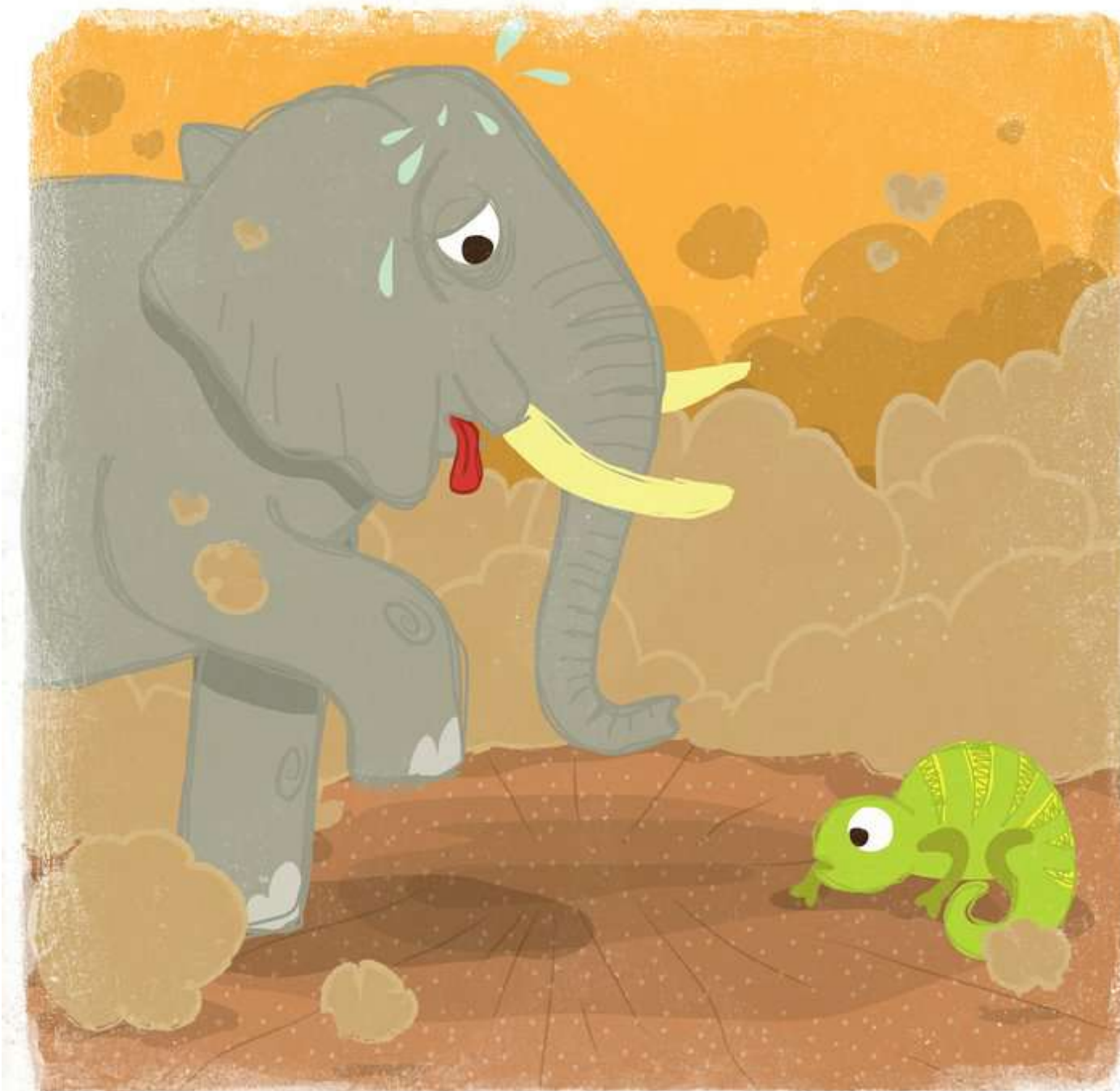
Nesse momento, havia em seca terrível nas terras. O rei teve uma ideia e chamou seus dois vizinhos ao palácio.
