


# Run from the Volcano! Detta Devia Rifqah Mufidah

Luta felt a vibration quite mysterious. Because of that, he grew curious.




What could it be? Let's go and see!

Eagle arrived with news to share. Smoke from the mountaintop was filling the air.




This news must be spread, that was the plan. But the other langur did not understand. They didn't believe in Luta's claim. Luta was frustrated. Being cautious was his only aim.

Everyone quickly ran away. "Run, and don't stop," Luta would say.




They arrived at the nearest village in sight. Why were the humans fleeing in fright? Were they also afraid of the leopard's bite?

- Blup!




The animals waited for another sign or a sound.

## Let's Learn About: Signs of Volcanic Eruptions

When a volcano is about to erupt, there are signs that we can observe. One of them is the movement of animals away from the volcano. Before the eruption, pressure builds up inside the volcano. This pressure creates sounds and vibrations that can only be heard and felt by the animals near the volcano. That's why they immediately move away from the volcano. Besides that, there are other signs such as earthquakes, smoke emmiting from the volcano's summit, rising temperatures, and repeated rumbling sounds.

Humans need tools to capture those sounds and vibrations. One such tool is a seismograph, which is placed in volcanic monitoring stations. Thanks to this tool, officials can warn people living near the volcano to evacuate before an eruption occurs.
