This fun hands-on project **encouraged self-awareness** as learners looked at their reflections and thought about what makes them unique. Through this experience, they learned that everyone has special qualities that make them who they are and that these differences make our classroom community vibrant and special. The activity fostered **creativity, fine motor skill development,** and **confidence** as children proudly showcased their personalized mirrors.











#### **KG1 – SUN RAYS COLLABORATIVE CRAFT**

KG1 learners joined together to create a bright and cheerful Sun Rays craft, working in small groups to complete a large, shared artwork. Each child carefully cut along straight lines to form the sun's rays and attached them to a big central sun shape, contributing their piece to the collective creation. This joyful and collaborative activity strengthened fine motor skills, improved scissor control, and enhanced hand-eye coordination. Beyond creativity, it encouraged teamwork and cooperation as learners worked side by side to bring their sunny masterpiece to life. The project also helped reinforce the concept of straight lines in a fun and meaningful way, while nurturing patience and focus as students practiced precision and care in their work.



#### **GRADE 2 EXPLORING TASTE AND SMELL**

As part of the disciplinary theme "Who We Are," Grade 2 students explored the senses of taste and smell through engaging classroom stations. Blindfolded, they smelled a variety of scents and tasted different foods, trying to guess what they were experiencing. This hands-on activity encouraged curiosity and observation while helping learners understand the important role that taste and smell play in daily life. It also fostered discussion and reflection as students compared their guesses and perceptions with peers, deepening their appreciation for how our senses shape our interactions with the world. Through this exploration, students developed a greater awareness of their own preferences and the diversity of sensory experiences among their classmates.















#### **GRADE 2 ROCKET NUMBERS ACTIVITY**

Grade 2A and B students took part in an exciting and interactive math activity called Rocket Order Race. Working in groups, they arranged numbered circles in the correct order — either from smallest to greatest or greatest to smallest — to form a colorful rocket trail. This engaging exercise allowed students to apply their understanding of number sequencing while sharpening their comparison and ordering skills. The activity also encouraged teamwork, communication, and quick thinking as groups collaborated to complete their rockets. Through this fun challenge, learners strengthened their numerical fluency while enjoying a dynamic, hands-on learning experience. It also fostered a sense of friendly competition and excitement, motivating students to focus and work efficiently with their peers.




































#### **GRADE 2 SENSORY OBSTACLE COURSE**

Grade 2A and 2B learners enthusiastically took part in a Sensory Obstacle Course, crawling on the floor to find hidden items placed around the classroom. They moved through various stations that challenged them to use their senses of touch, sight, hearing, and balance to complete each task. This engaging activity encouraged exploration and observation while helping students understand how different senses work together to guide movement and interaction with the environment. Through this playful experience, learners also developed coordination, problem-solving skills, and an appreciation for the role of their senses in navigating the world around them. The activity was not only educational but also lots of fun, keeping students active and fully engaged throughout.












#### **GRADE 2A CREATING NUMBER TREES**

Grade 2A students worked collaboratively to create a colorful Number Tree as part of their math lesson. In groups, they glued mixed numbers onto the branches and categorized them into even and odd numbers. This interactive activity allowed learners to practice identifying, comparing, and sorting numbers while reinforcing their understanding of number patterns. Through teamwork and hands-on engagement, students not only strengthened their mathematical reasoning but also developed communication and problem-solving skills. The project combined creativity with critical thinking, making number learning both enjoyable and meaningful. By the end of the activity, students proudly displayed their completed trees, celebrating their collective effort and growing confidence in working with numbers.





























#### **GRADE 4 - BUILDING THE MUSCULAR SYSTEM (PREPARATION PHASE)**

To begin their exploration of the human muscular system, Grade 4 A,B and C students participated in an **interactive anatomy session** where learning came to life through teamwork and creativity. Working in groups, they received cutout pieces representing major muscles of the human body, which they assembled like a puzzle to form anatomically accurate systems. Once complete, students glued their models onto poster papers and labeled each muscle, reinforcing their **understanding of structure and function**. The activity also prompted meaningful **discussions on maintaining muscular health** through exercise, proper nutrition, and adequate rest. This engaging preparation phase laid the foundation for their upcoming presentations and supported **SDG 3: Good Health and Well-Being** by emphasizing the importance of physical health awareness.













#### **GRADE 4 PRESENTING THE MUSCULAR SYSTEM**

Following their preparation, Grade 4 students proudly presented their completed muscular system projects to the class. Each group explained the major muscles — such as the biceps, triceps, and quadriceps — and described how these work together to enable movement and strength. Their confident presentations showcased not only their scientific understanding but also their collaboration, communication, and creative expression. Through this project, students connected theory with real-life application, developing a deeper appreciation of the human body and the role of healthy habits in keeping it strong. This culminating activity reinforced SDG 3: Good Health and Well-Being, highlighting the link between learning and lifelong wellness.












































#### **GRADE 4 EXPLORING THE RESPIRATORY SYSTEM**


As part of their unit on body systems, Grade 4A and 4B students explored the fascinating functions of the respiratory system, learning about its parts, how it works, and how it connects with other systems to keep the body alive and healthy. In groups, students prepared creative projects using colorful cutouts of lungs and airways made from blue and red paper, or constructed box models with arrows to illustrate the exchange of oxygen in the blood. Each group then presented their project to the class, explaining the concept and process of breathing in their own words. This hands-on and collaborative activity deepened their understanding of how the human body functions while fostering teamwork, creativity, and confidence in public speaking.
























#### **GRADE 5 EXPLORING THE DIVERSITY OF CULTURES**


Grade 5 students embarked on an engaging exploration of cultural diversity, learning about different aspects of cultures around the world and focusing in particular on two selected countries. Working collaboratively, they researched traditions, history, and daily life, then created visual representations of their findings to share with peers and the school community. Their presentations highlighted the richness and uniqueness of each culture while emphasizing the importance of respecting and appreciating differences. Through this activity, students deepened their understanding of global diversity, strengthened their communication skills, and celebrated the values of inclusion and open-mindedness.

































#### **GRADE 10 – INVESTIGATING THE HEATING CURVE OF WATER**

As part of their unit on the Particulate Nature of Matter, Grade 10 Science students conducted a lab practical to explore the heating curve of water. After learning about the changes in states of matter and the Kinetic Molecular Theory, students applied their knowledge by supplying constant heat to ice and recording temperature changes every 30 seconds until the water reached its boiling point. They then plotted the heating curve based on their observations, strengthening their understanding of energy transfer and molecular behavior. This practical experiment encouraged analytical thinking and scientific inquiry, giving students a deeper appreciation of how scientific concepts connect to real-world processes.

On October 10th, CISA celebrated International Music Day with a lively gathering at the main entrance. During the final hours of the school day, most classes came together to enjoy a joyful showcase of musical talent. #### **CISA FOOD FESTIVAL 2025**


