CISA EXPO 2025: MIDWAY EVALUATION



GRADE 1 ANGOLA'S WEATHER PRESENTATION

Grade 1A and 1B students took a creative approach to understanding how weather impacts daily life and the environment in Luanda. As part of their unit, they designed poster, small handcrafted models and makets to represent different weather conditions—both regular and extreme—and showcased how these affect transportation, buildings, and overall safety. The activity encouraged students to think critically about their local environment while expressing their ideas through hands-on, artistic creations. Their work also aligns with SDG Goal 13: Climate Action, as it fostered early awareness about adapting to weather-related challenges and promoted practical safety tips for everyday life.

The CISA CARE CENTER students marked Friendship Day with a warm and creative Art Therapy Friday session. GRADE 3 HEROES PRESENTATION TO GRADE 5

This summative assessment deepened their grasp of the big idea while allowing them to apply Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills in authentic, purposeful ways—expressing their perspectives with confidence and creativity.












GRADE 5 EXPLORING CLIMATES AROUND THE WORLD

Grade 5A, B, and C students went on a learning journey across the globe as they explored the climatic and geographic conditions of a country or region of their choice. After gathering information through research and discussions, they compared their selected locations to Angola, identifying similarities and differences in weather patterns, landscapes, and environmental challenges. This activity deepened their understanding of global diversity and encouraged critical thinking about how geography shapes daily life. It also connects to **SDG Goal 13: Climate Action**, as students reflected on how climate influences human activity and the importance of adapting to environmental conditions around the world.
