4. CISA Support Programs

CISA Support Program – C1, C2, C3

At Cedars International School of Angola (CISA), our Support Program provides three levels of academic and personal assistance to ensure that every student can succeed:

- **C1 – Mild Support**
 - For students who need occasional, light assistance with specific concepts or skills.
 - Support can be handled within the classroom, during regular school time by the subject teacher.
- **C2 – Moderate Support**
 - For students with deep difficulty in certain subjects, requiring a special plan.
 - Solutions may include:
 - In-class support by support staff.
 - Parallel classes in small groups for targeted teaching.
 - Reinforcement classes during extended elective periods.
 - This level combines flexibility with structured intervention, ensuring learning continuity inside and outside the main class schedule.
- **C3 – Intensive Support**
 - For students with special educational needs and/or psychological issues.
 - Requires personalized education plans, continuous monitoring, and in some cases, collaboration with external specialists.
 - Parents are actively engaged, and progress is reviewed regularly with the CCC.



4. CISA Support Programs

CCC (CISA Care Center)

Role of the CISA Care Center (CCC)

The CCC (CISA Care Center) is the central unit responsible for:

- **Assessing** students' academic, behavioral, and emotional **needs**.
- **Designing individualized support** plans and following up on their progress.
- **Providing** psychological **guidance** and ensuring inclusion of all students.
- **Acting as the link** between teachers, families, and external personal specialists.



5. Financial Policy

The financial policy of CISA is designed to provide international quality education at reasonable fees, making it accessible and suitable for more families.

- Entrance Fee* : 500.000 AOA per family.
- Campus Fee* : 500.000 AOA per family.
- Registration Fee* : 300.000 AOA per student.
- KG class material : 300.000 AOA per student.
- CISA Bracelet* : 200.000 AOA per student.

- Confirmation Fee : 200.000 AOA per student.
- CISA Bracelet renewal fee : 100.000 AOA per student.
- KG class material : 300.000 AOA per student.

- **Education Support Fees (parallel or after class support, C2 program):** Estimated upon student evaluation and added to the base fee (charged on base annual fees).
 - **CISA Care Centre Fees (additional support and intervention for students with learning difficulties, C3 programs):** Estimated upon student evaluation and added to the base fee (charged on base annual fees).
- Invoices are sent by email, make sure your email is updated, it is the parents' responsibility to communicate with the billing office if no invoices are received.
 - Proof of payments must be submitted within the invoice deadline to avoid any academic disturbances.
 - Payment's deadline: check invoice.
 - Overdue fees are subjected to 10% late fee.
 - Students with due fee will have their CISA bracelet deactivated which will prevent their access to school and will loose access to the CISA account.
 - CISA bracelet reactivation fee: 50.000 AOA, reactivation time: up to 48h.
 - All above fees are not reimbursable in the event of student's expulsion, absence including due to suspension or withdrawal from the school.

Based on the presidential decree approving a 19.11% increase on the tuition fee, the board approved an increase of an average of 9% over last year fees.

All prices and regulation were approved by the board as of June 2025 and are subject to changes without prior notice.



6. Communication Channels & Parents' Meetings

- **WhatsApp** – the primary tool for quick updates, reminders, and announcements.
- **Direct Calls** – parents may call the school directly to book meetings, with the support of the reception team.
- **Email Communication** – for official notices, reports, and documentation.
- **CISA Digital Cloud* Platform** – parents have secure access to follow students' actions, classwork, results, and school updates in real time.

Parents' Meetings:

- **Continuous access:** parents can request meetings with teachers, coordinators, or administration at any point during the academic year.
- **Scheduled meetings:** formal parents' meetings are organized regularly to review student progress, assessments, and school developments.
-  **In short:** CISA provides open, multi-channel communication through WhatsApp, direct calls, email, and the Digital Platform, complemented by continuous and scheduled meetings across the year.



7. CUPP - CISA University Preparation Program

The CISA University Preparation Program (CUPP) is a specialized academic and guidance track designed to prepare high school students for university admission worldwide.

Main Features:

1. **University Guidance:** Support in career orientation, subject choices, and application strategies.
2. **Academic Preparation:** Focus on advanced courses aligned with international standards (IB, American, College Board SAT & AP)
3. **Exams & Certifications:** Preparation for SAT, AP, and other international requirements.
4. **Counseling:** Individual and group sessions on career paths, study skills, and personal goals.
5. **Global Readiness:** Development of skills needed for success in international higher education.



Pedagogic Options & Certificates

"International education is not about a school's name or simply applying a foreign curriculum. It is about the real opportunities a school provides through internationally recognized certificates. Families, students, and the school—as advisor—share the responsibility of choosing the right pathway, carefully considering the possibilities, qualifications, and timelines." Dr. Imad Taha

At CISA, we provide our students with **various certificate options** that open doors to universities worldwide:

1. CISA High School Certificate (Basic Option) (School regular enrollment timing).

- Fully aligned with the american curriculum by COGNIA and IB framework, recognized by the **Ministry of Education of Angola**.
- Represents the **basic CISA program**.

2. CISA High School Certificate + College Board Support*

In addition to the CISA High School Certificate, students can strengthen their profiles with **College Board international credentials**:

- **SAT International Exam*** (Available from **G10**), accepted by most universities worldwide.
- **Advanced Placement (AP) Courses*** (Available from **G11**) in subjects chosen by students, providing university-level preparation and strengthening admission prospects. This pathway **facilitates access to top universities globally**.

3. IB Diploma Programme (IBDP)* (Available only for G11 through 2 academic years)

- Offered through CISA's **official candidacy with the International Baccalaureate (IB)**, in partnership with **Eastwood College**.
- A prestigious program recognized by universities worldwide.

4. Double Certificate (UK Pathway)* (Available for G12)

- Alongside the G12 in CISA, students are **enrolled in St. Andrews College (Cambridge)**, to obtain additional "**University Foundation Certificate***", recognized by most British universities.

This pathway provides a direct bridge into higher education in the UK and Europe.

Important Note: All options marked with * require **additional fees**, which vary depending on each student's chosen pathway, all programs details are available by: **CUPP (CISA UNIVERSITY PREPARATION PROGRAM)**



8. Assessment & Weighted Subjects (100/50/25)

Assessment & Weighted Subjects at CISA

At CISA, not all subjects carry the same weight. To ensure balance between core, complementary, and support subjects, the school applies a weighted marks system:

- **100 Marks Subjects (Core)**
 - Example: English, Mathematics, Sciences,
 - Must be achieved across all 3 trimesters
 - Represent the foundation of academic success
- **50 Marks Subjects (Complementary)**
 - Example: Humanities, ICT, Social Studies
 - Must be achieved in at least 2 trimesters
 - Provide depth and connection to real-world knowledge
- **25 Marks Subjects (Support & Enrichment)**
 - Example: Arts, Music, Physical Education, Clubs
 - Must be achieved in at least 1 trimester
 - Ensure holistic development of students
-  **Final Result** = Arithmetic sum of trimester averages, considering subject weight (100/50/25).



9. CISA Clubs

- **Red Cross Club** – Community service, first aid, social responsibility.
- **Arts & Music Club** – Painting, crafts, creative expression.
- **Robotics Club** – Coding, robotics, science projects, innovation challenges.
- **Sports Clubs** – Football Practice
- **Languages & Culture Club** – French, Arabic, Portuguese
- **Environmental Club** – Sustainability, recycling projects, green campus initiatives.
- **Drama & Debate Club** – Acting, Public Speaking.



10. CISA Bracelet Services & Attendance

The CISA Bracelet is an electronic wristband provided to all students that serves as a multi-purpose school tool.

Main Functions:

- **Attendance:** Records entry and exit automatically for safety and monitoring.
- **Payments:** Works as a digital wallet for cafeteria, school shop, and services (cashless system).
- **Access & Security:** Identifies students inside the school premises and helps track movement.
- **Health & Nutrition:** Can block purchases of restricted foods (allergies, dietary rules).

11. Students Re-Enrollment

CISA reminds all parents to be attentive to registration deadlines for upcoming school years.

1. The school cannot guarantee a student's place if registration is not completed within the announced deadlines.
2. The final registration is only confirmed when:
 - Parents receive the official registration invoice by email, and
 - The payment of this invoice is made within the due date.
3. The sending of the registration renewal invoice depends on:
 - a. The family's financial history with the school,
 - b. The general conduct of the family in their relationship with CISA, and
 - c. The evaluation of the CISA Board in cases of student behavior issues.
